Vice-President: Fill in for the absent President at Board meetings. Work with the Board and with members on various events throughout the year. Prepare to take over as President if desired.

Interclub Representative/Permit Courts. The Board position organizes USTA\SATA men's and women's league teams. Maintains a spreadsheet of the teams, captains, the day of the week and times each team uses the high school courts for home games. Sends spreadsheet to Membership Coordinator to post calendar on courts and to Webmaster to post on DTC website. Permits courts for league use and other DTC events.

Membership Chair: Keeps track of DTC members. Ensures all participants in leagues are members of DTC. Notifies members of information as directed by the Board. Assists in tennis socials and other club events.

Treasurer: Keeps track of club funds. Provides Board with current account balances (2 accounts) at monthly Board meetings. Pays various invoices and dues as requested. Orders equipment as needed. Works with accountant for end-of-year taxes filings for non-profit organization. Current Treasurer extraordinaire Chris Dewees will mentor and train his replacement.
