Clubhouse Update

The Davis Tennis Club board has completed Phase 1 of the design process with Mak Design+Build of Davis. This means that we now have a floor plan, preliminary specifications, and an estimate for construction costs. The City of Davis has installed the containers for the Veteran's Memorial Theatre's equipment which had been stored in the Guild Building (our new clubhouse site). So, we're now awaiting a Structural Engineer's design for the roof of the building, and then we can secure the necessary permits to begin work!

received an estimate of \$60,000 from Mak Design+Build to complete our project. To cut up to \$15,000 off that estimate, the board decided to serve as "Owner/ builders" ourselves, hiring Mak Design+Build as subcontractors to complete the new exterior roof, exterior siding, doors, and windows. With the \$25,000 we now have available in our accounts, we can complete this phase, and then raise more funds for interior work such as electrical, cabinetry, and drywall.

We've begun the process of securing a USTA grant for approximately \$12,000 and look forward to using the expertise and skills of club members to help with demolition and labor.

We urge you to <u>donate</u> to the project as you renew your membership dues for 2011. Your <u>donation</u> is taxdeductible, and you can now use the PayPal link on our <u>website</u> to make your payment. After many years, we're finally close to making a Davis Tennis Clubhouse a reality!

We'll alert you via email and the website when we're ready to "strap on our toolbelts" and go to work.


